Maths		Continue of fractions and decimals. Daily mental maths, arithmetic sessions and daily timetables. Problem solving linking to topic where possible. Focus for the Year 4s for all the times tables up to 12. Introduction of measurement and shape.
Science		Identify that animals including humans need the right amount of nutrition, and they get their nutrition from what they eat. Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. Describe the functions and basic parts of the digestive system in humans. Identify the different types of teeth in humans. Construct and interpret a variety of food chain, identifying producers, predators and prey.
